### Our History And Traditional Practices Are Problematic

1. Nonprofits + Philanthropy are a political and economic system

2. Most wealth is made through pain and destruction (extraction)

3. Foundations were created as tax shelters and ways for wealthy families to continue to hold power for generations

4. In the U.S., nonprofits were created by white women to help...who?

If "charity" is supposed to resolve systemic issues, and charities are dependent on funders, Then we give funders (who are part of the system) power, influence and control over other people's lives

# CCF: A Set of Principles + Values Framework

### **Ask the Question:**

- **WHO** is defining equity?
- WHY is that standard being set?
- WHO makes decisions?
- WHY do they have that power?
- WHAT can we do?

## 11 Principles

- 1. Fundraising must be grounded in *race*, *equity* and *social justice*.
- Individual org missions are not as important as the collective community.
- 3. Nonprofits are generous with and mutually supportive of one another.
- 4. All who engage in strengthening the community are equally valued.
- 5. Time is valued as equally as money.
- 6. We treat donors as partners and this means we are transparent and occasionally have difficult conversations.

- 7. We foster a sense of belonging, *not othering*.
- 8. We promote the understanding that everyone personally benefits from engaging in the work of social justice not just charity and compassion.
- 9. We see the work of social justice as holistic and transformative, not transactional.
- We recognize that healing and liberation require a commitment to economic justice.
- 11. We commit to the work of internal, interpersonal, and interorganizational healing.

### Principle #8:

We promote the understanding that everyone personally benefits from engaging in the work of social justice – not just charity and compassion...
